# 5. Leadership Update

- a. Management
  - i. The coronavirus pandemic has created uncertainty regarding whether online schools should continue operating as normal. Per MAPSA guidance from 3/26, we will continue operating. Superintendent Lowry has been gathering information and reporting to families on a regular basis.



- ii. Schools will receive full state aid this academic year, but next year is uncertain. NextLvl will continue to update the Board as information is available.
- iii. Michigan has applied for a state testing waiver from the U.S. Department of Education. No further information is available at this time.
- iv. Doug McNeil Dan Quisenberry (MAPSA president) noted that cyber schools are the only schools that can continue with business as usual and be entirely and legally compliant.

#### b. K-12 Overview

- i. Superintendent Lowry presented academic data and progress toward school goals.
- ii. Spring Count: 177 counted of 180 possible FTE
- iii. Attendance at Advisory is 60% or better. Teachers contact individual students who do not attend the Wednesday session.
- iv. Superintendent Lowry has held Administrative Attendance Conferences with 12 of 38 families of disengaged students. Student and family engagement has increased with more parents at home during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- v. The current curriculum is not living up to expectations. There number of errors and other issues has become unmanageable. Staff have created a robust rubric to evaluate other options. Once there are 2-3 options, parents and students will be invited to help vet the choices.
- vi. Retention rate: 74% Mid-semester enrollments are struggling. Transition and learning the program takes time. Teachers and staff are working on building relationships and assisting with the transition.
- vii. Creating a Caring Environment through Friday Fun Day, study halls, 1:1 and check-ins every week

## 6. Board Strategy and Planning

- a. Dr. Tim Wood Proposing the Board establish an enrollment cap of 200 students for the 2019-20 academic year. We do not currently have the resources to provide equipment and teachers for more than 200 students.
- b. Motion to adopt the 200 student cap for the 2019-20 academic year by Jeff Bell, seconded by Mary Harwood, all members aye, motion carried.
